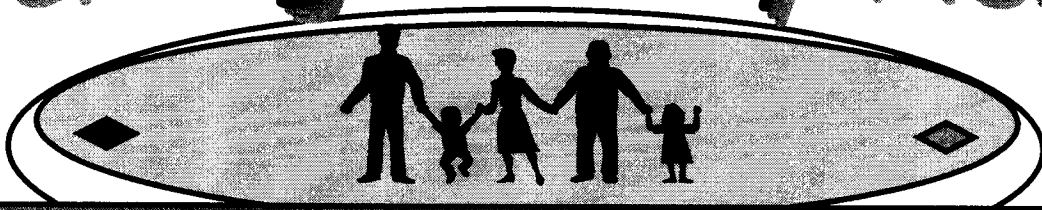

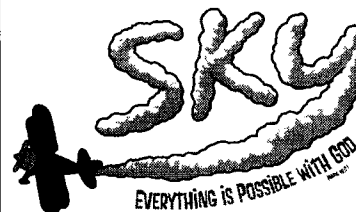

Randy & Cheryl Bevis - THAILAND

"We have had to put off travel to America until we complete the adoption of Daniel. Randy has focused the last few months on the camp and this has freed Randy to be able to help at the camp site. Attending Covenant Bible Camps was an important part of his walk in faith growing up and he would like to help provide opportunities for children and adults in Thailand to be able to encounter Christ and become loving followers of Jesus through this camp project. Once completed we will open an after-school program for underprivileged youth in the villages near the camp and also hold youth camps throughout the year. This summer's VBS mission project will help 2 camps here in Thailand run an after-school program using music and sports to minister to several hundred underprivileged children. Thank you for your support and encouragement as we minister here in Thailand."

HCBC Bylaws Proposed Amendment Summary

1. Written requests regarding membership changes will be **directed to the church administrative secretary** (currently Diana Hult) who will route to the appropriate person for action.
 2. A "definition" of "**Active**" membership has been added
 3. "**Attendance**" was added to **Section 4** regarding **responsibility of membership**
 4. **Section 5 Discipline of Members** has been changed to "**Erring Members**" and the paragraphs regarding **Negligent Members; Discipline or Dismissal** have been removed.
 5. **Section 7 "Removal" of Membership** has been changed to "**Withdrawal**" of Membership
 6. **Article VIII Amendments** the wording has been changed **to match the amendment process stated in the Articles of Incorporation** – instead of 90 days prior, amendments shall be presented in writing to the council and that the proposed amendment was announced and presented in written form at not less than two morning worship services on consecutive Sundays

Bylaws

Heritage Community Bible Church (HCBC)

Article I

Membership

Section 1. Admission into Active Membership

a) Definition of Active Membership

Members in good standing are those actively involved in the life of the church and supportive of its ministries. Active involvement needs to satisfy the responsibilities as outlined in Section 4 of this document (Responsibility of Membership). One year of non-involvement or non-support of the life of the church will result in "inactive" membership status. Inactive members will be dropped from the membership list after two years. Homebound members or those unable to attend due to health or aging concerns will retain their active status in spite of attendance, support or service limitations.

b) Application for membership

A written application for membership or associate membership shall directed to the church **via the administrative secretary who will route to the appropriate parties for action**. The applicant shall complete a course in the Inquirers' Class or Confirmation, after which he/she shall appear before the pastor(s) and the chairperson of the Congregational Life Ministry Team to give a confession of his/her Christian faith, according to the Sixth Article of the Restated Articles of Incorporation. When the application has been reviewed and the testimony received favorably, the applicant shall be presented to the congregation as provided in paragraph d) of this section.

c) Transfer of membership

Applicants from other Christian Churches shall submit letters of transfer when available, to the church **via the administrative secretary who will route to the appropriate parties for action. The senior pastor or the chairperson of the Congregational Life Ministry Team shall review and initiate action according to the requirements of paragraph a) of this section.**

d) Reception of new members

Applicants who are accepted into the membership of the Heritage Community Bible Church (Church) shall be

welcomed at the next Sunday service and shall make public confession of their Christian faith, as outlined in A Book of Worship for Covenant Churches.

Section 4. Responsibility of membership

Every member shall assume the responsibilities and obligations placed on him/her by the Word of God and the Church. He/she shall through his/her witness by life and word, consecrated service, **attendance**, prayer, and financial support further the cause of Christ in the local Church, the Evangelical Covenant Church (Covenant) and its local regional conference.

Section 5. Erring Members

a) Erring members

A member known to err in doctrine or conduct shall be counseled according to the procedure outlined in Matthew 18:15-18 and Galatians 6:1. A fellow member(s) having knowledge of such error shall in the spirit of Christian love seek to restore the brother or sister. If he/she fails to heed the counsel of the Council, this matter shall be brought before a membership business meeting.

(Sections removed; Negligent Members; Discipline or Dismissal)

Section 6. Transfer of members

A member who moves to another community should soon thereafter identify himself/herself with the local Covenant Church. If there is no Covenant Church, he/she should identify himself with some other evangelical Christian Church. Application for transfer of membership shall be made in writing to the **church via the administrative secretary who will distribute the request to the appropriate parties for issuance of the transfer** to the Church with which a member is uniting. Withdrawal of said membership shall be reported through the Council to the next membership business meeting, where it shall be made a matter of record.

Section 7. Withdrawal of membership

Request for withdrawal from membership in the Church shall be made in writing to the **church via the administrative secretary who will route to the appropriate parties for action**. Members who move away from the area may retain their Associate Membership if so requested in writing, and renewed in writing not less frequently than once every three years. If written renewal request is not received after a period of three years, the lapse will result in automatic removal of membership.

Article VIII Amendments

Amendments to these Bylaws not in conflict with the Articles of Incorporation may be adopted at any annual membership business meeting, or at a special membership business meeting called for that purpose, by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, ~~provided that such amendments have been presented in writing to the Council and presented at a membership business meeting not less than ninety (90) days prior~~ **provided that the proposed amendment was announced and presented in written form at not less than two morning worship services on consecutive Sundays.**
